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Summer Reading Assignment 2018 6th Grade

Over the summer, all rising 6° grade students will read TWO books of their own choice. One MUST be a fiction or historical fiction book; the second MUST be a non-fiction book. The students who are planning to participate in the Battle of the Books may use any of their required reading for this summer assignment.

The following responses to your reading must be completed:

Fiction or Historical Fiction Book

- Could you think of another ending for your novel? Write about it.
- Could the story take place in another setting? Consider time as well as place. Explain your answer.
- What is the theme (message) in the story? Is this theme something you have read in other books?

Non-Fiction Book

- What was the most interesting thing you learned about?
- Do you think the book did a good job of teaching you about the topic? Why or why not?
- If the book was about a person, what questions would you ask him or her?

IMPORTANT!! Your submissions MUST be formatted using the following guidelines ~

- keep your writing to ONE page for EACH book
- double-space your lines
- use a 12-point, Times New Roman or similar font
- tell me the name of your novel and the author
- make sure YOUR NAME is clearly indicated on each paper

Your writing should be revised and edited~

- Check spelling
- Check punctuation
- Check capitalization
- Check grammar

Only the final draft needs to be turned in.
